
Interview 5 w. Emma Kauhi, by C. Langlas 12/18/90 (notes on a brief conversation)

-- Kauhi family and Kahilihiwas



(died as baby; had Hawn. name; her H Herman didn't; she asked why but he didn't know; thinks because the first Herman died)

Charley Kauhi worked at Ka Lua Pele (HVNP) a long time (like a ranger but they didn't call it that in those days); when she md. Herman the F had already worked there a long time

his first wife Lili died young, EK remembers seeing her when her GM took her to visit one time, 'ili kea w. 'ehu hair (beautiful); she died in Ka'u at Moa'ula (ma 'o aku o Pahala), on a visit to her family there; came from Hauani'o family

Herman left home at 14 (M still alive) because his F did something bad to him (hana ino ia ia), lived w. someone else, somehow went with his M to Ka'u; she got sick and died there; he rode horse home (in the night?) to volcano to tell the family and they went and had the funeral there (Always seemed like such a moving story to me. Can you imagine riding through the night in those days w/o lights.)

Herman didn't care about his family because ha'alele when 14 so she never heard much

after Charley Kauhi retired, he md. Mrs. Kahilihiwa (widow) and had two more children by her (Donald, Teresa)

<u>Kekahuna Kahilihiwa</u> first lived at Ki, near to Maria Roberts' house (she mentioned him as one who took out canoe there in her story); later, while she was still young, he moved to Kalapana and built the house there next to SOTS church; unsure--thinks maybe he tore down the house at Ki to build Kalapana house
